Pottery Coordinator's report

Monday night pottery continues to be an entertaining night, with a vibrant, energetic group, chatty group who enjoy evolving and experimenting with new ideas. (Who said champagne and cake is sometimes served?)

We would like to welcome Monika Muschal back. She has had some weeks off to recover from a very painful leg injury and we have missed her very much.

Other good news is our dear friend Helen Christoff is slowly recovering from ill health and a family tragedy and hopes to rejoin our group in 2019. We have missed her dearly and can't wait until we once again can pick her brains for the extensive knowledge she has of pottery techniques.

The Saturday group is up and running. At the moment has three potters taking advantage of the facilities and there is room for more. Contact Michael Dausmann on his Facebook group: BMCAC Saturday Potters. You must be a member of BMCAC Pottery to be a part of this group. Monday and Saturday potters also pay \$5 per each visit. The annual membership for BMCAC Potters is \$65. They pay the extra \$15 fee to allow us to offer such low kiln fee charges and to help maintain the kilns, wheels and equipment. Every repair necessary for our kilns and wheels is very costly.

We would like to thank Alan Campbell very much for making the dollies that now hold our extensive range of moulds, freeing up much needed shelf space for our ever growing classes.

Thanks also to Ingrid who thought to purchase new leather gloves for unpacking hot pots.

The kilns have been very busy over the last few weeks trying to get student work complete. Just a reminder – please always put all the kiln shelves back into the correct space. Do not leave the small kiln shelves in front of the kiln, there is space on the right side of the kiln on the floor. It is very dangerous if shelves are left impinging on the walking space when you are unpacking hot pots.

I hope by recutting some larger shelves we currently cannot use and buying some new shelves, we will be more flexible with packing both kilns in 2019.

Before we begin in the new year, we may have a busy day for us to bat wash kiln shelves and make some much needed new setters for the kilns. Hope to see you then.


Tempered Glass Mosaics

with Marian Shapiro

Come and join award winning mosaic artist Marian Shapiro for this one and a half day workshop on Tempered Glass Mosaic. Use paint, papers and other materials under tempered glass (crash glass), combined with other materials to produce an exquisite, small hanging mosaic (25 c m x 25 cm) suitable for interior display. Alternatively you can mosaic a mirror frame.

Appropriate materials sufficient for a small mosaic are provided, but you are very welcome to bring extra materials to make your piece unique and personal. Presentations and books give you lots of inspiration. You get detailed notes and as classes are small, lots of individual attention. And of course, your mosaic creation to take home.
